	<p>While voting against clean energy-----which could cost Nevada thousands of good-paying jobs.</p>	<p><b>Heller voted against extending solar investment tax credit that would create 9,000 Nevada jobs.</b> Heller voted against the Renewable Energy and Job Creation Tax Act of 2008, which included an 8-year extension of the 30-percent federal investment tax credit for residential and commercial solar installations. According to the Solar Energy Industries Association, an independent study conducted by Navigant Consulting found that an 8-year extension of the solar investment tax credit in 2008 would create 9,000 jobs in Nevada by 2016.
