Re: Oppose H.R. 3, a bill to approve the dirty Keystone XL pipeline

Dear Representative,

The League of Conservation Voters (LCV) works to turn environmental values into national priorities. Each year, LCV publishes the *National Environmental Scorecard*, which details the voting records of members of Congress on environmental legislation. The *Scorecard* is distributed to LCV members, concerned voters nationwide, and the media.

LCV urges you to vote NO on H.R.3, yet another bill that would automatically approve the dirty and dangerous Keystone XL tar sands pipeline, eliminating the State Department's ability to assess whether the pipeline is in the national interest and the President's authority to ultimately approve or reject the project.

Construction of this pipeline clearly fails President Obama's climate test and conflicts with the vision laid out in his Climate Action Plan. With falling crude oil prices, pipeline constraints, and limited rail traffic, the Keystone XL pipeline will lead to a significant expansion of tar sands development, which would unleash massive amounts of carbon pollution. Furthermore, given TransCanada's terrible safety record and the particularly toxic nature of tar sands oil, Keystone XL would seriously threaten surrounding communities, ecosystems, and watersheds including the vital Ogallala aquifer, which provides drinking water for millions of Americans.

Keystone XL poses significant risks and provides no tangible benefits to the United States. The pipeline is intended to ship refined tar sands oil overseas, so it will not enhance America's energy independence. Congress should be supporting policies, like the expired production tax credit that that will grow the economy and advance clean energy, not projects that keep us hooked on dirty fossil fuels.

We urge you to vote NO on H.R.3, yet another attempt to disregard due process and endanger public health and the environment by forcing approval of the dirty and dangerous Keystone XL pipeline. We will strongly consider including votes on this bill in the 2015 *Scorecard*.
