

PROPOSAL DIRECTLY BENEFITS TEN PIONEERS AND RANGERS

Bush's campaign contributors from 2000 to 2004 include 10 Pioneers and Rangers from the Electric Utility Industry who would benefit from the proposed mercury regulation.
