**December 5, 2011: Pruitt Received \$1,000 From A Major Oil & Natural Gas Company's PAC.** On December 5, 2011, Pruitt received \$1,000 from the political action committee of Spectra Energy, a major oil and natural gas company. **December 21, 2011: Pruitt Received \$3,000 From Exxon Mobil's PAC.** On December 21, 2011, Pruitt received \$3,000 from the political action committee of Exxon Mobil. [National Institute on Money in State Politics, accessed 1/16/17]

Pruitt's Office Urged Devon Energy Executives To Watch The Atty. Gen. Discuss Fracking On Television; Devon Energy Execs Were Thrilled With Pruitt's Performance. In December 2011, an employee of the Oklahoma Attorney General's office wrote to the Executive VP of Public Affairs and the Public Policy Coordinator of Devon Energy, saying, "I hope you get a chance to see AG Pruitt's question on EPA and fracking to Gov. Romney. He was a co-host of a presidential candidate on Fox Huckabee." Bill Whitsitt, Executive VP of Public Affairs at Devon Energy, wrote back, saying, "I'm watching the ... broadcast. So proud of Scott!" [New York Times, 12/6/14]

2011: Two Days After Devon Energy & Continental Resources, Two Groups That Enthusiastically Support Fracking, Gave \$150,000 (Total) To RAGA, Pruitt Protested EPA's Fracking Study

Two Days After Devon Energy Gave \$125K To RAGA, Which Pruitt "Helps Lead," Pruitt Wrote To The EPA "Protesting Its Proposal To Study The Impact Of Fracking." In December 2014, the <u>Tulsa World</u> reported, "Two days after Devon Energy contributed \$125,000 to a national association that Oklahoma Attorney General Scott Pruitt helps lead, Pruitt wrote a letter to the EPA protesting its proposal to study the impact of fracking, records show. For its contribution on March 31, Devon, an Oklahoma City-based Fortune 500 company, qualified for the highest level of access offered by the Republican Attorneys General Association at its four annual conferences ... Pruitt is a two-time past chairman of the association and now serves on its executive committee." [Tulsa World, 12/9/14]

March 31, 2014: Devon Energy Donated \$125,000 to RAGA. [CQ Moneyline, Republican Attorneys General Association, Accessed 12/22/16; IRS, 527 Report of Contribution and Expenditures, 4/15/14]

Devon Energy Touted Fracking As Part Of Its Work. Devon
Energy's website states, "Our application of horizontal drilling,
combined with hydraulic fracturing, broke the access code to
shale, the stingy resource rock that had frustrated energy
companies for more than a century ... Hydraulic fracturing is a
safe and environmentally compatible technique that has been
conducted more than a million times in the United States over
the past 60 years with a clean record of groundwater protection.
The practice is overseen by state regulatory agencies." [Devon
Energy, accessed 1/16/17]

March 31, 2014: Continental Resources, Another Oil Company, Gave \$25,000 To RAGA. In December 2014, the <u>Tulsa World</u> reported, "The RAGA also received \$25,000 from Continental Resources, an independent oil company based in Oklahoma City. The contribution was made March 31, the same date Devon made its contribution and two days before Pruitt's letter was sent to the EPA." [Tulsa World, 12/9/14]

• CEO Of Continental Resources Was A "Fracker-In-Chief" And A Possible Trump Cabinet Nominee. In July 2016, CNBC reported that Donald Trump was considering Continental Resources CEO and "top fracking mogul" Harold Hamm for a cabinet position. The article continued, "Hamm, 70, became one of America's wealthiest men during the U.S. oil and gas drilling boom over the past decade, tapping into new hydraulic fracturing drilling technology to access vast deposits in North Dakota's shale fields ... 'Given that Hamm's as close as we've got to a fracker-in-chief in this country, it would be an apropos pick for a president who thinks global warming is a hoax manufactured by the Chinese,' said leading environmental activist Bill McKibben." April 2, 2014: Scott Pruitt Sent Letter to EPA Inspector General Asking Him to Reconsider Fracking Study. In April 2014, Pruitt wrote to the EPA, saying, "I am writing to express my concern over your February 5,2014, Memorandum in which you announce that the EPA's Office of Inspector General (OIG) is beginning preliminary research on the EPA's and states' ability to manage potential threats to water resources from hydraulic fracturing. I am concerned that this project is politically motivated and ignores the EPA's three previous failed attempts to link hydraulic fracturing to water contamination." Dirty Energy Industry Has Given \$350,000 Directly To Pruitt

Dirty Energy Interests Have Given Nearly \$350,000 Directly To

**Pruitt's Political Campaigns.** Over the course of his political career, Pruitt has raised \$345,246 from dirty energy interests, including \$276,611 from oil & gas, \$42,385 from electric utilities, and \$26,250 from mining. [National Institute on Money in State Politics, accessed 1/16/17]

2012 – 2016: Pruitt Served In Leadership Of The Republican
Attorneys General Association (RAGA) And The Rule Of Law
Defense Fund, A Group Set Up To Solicit Undisclosable Donations

March 2012 – January 2014: Scott Pruitt Served As Chairman Of RAGA. Scott Pruitt was elected chairman of the Republican Attorneys General Association in March 2012, and re-elected to that position in February 2013. South Carolina Attorney General Alan Wilson took over the role in 2014. [Journal Record, 3/7/12; OK Atty Gen's Office, 2/25/13; Associated Press, 11/29/13]

Pruitt Set Up The Rule Of Law Defense Fund That "Allows Companies Benefiting From The Actions Of Mr. Pruitt And Other Republican Attorneys General To Make Anonymous Donations, In **Unlimited Amounts."** According to the New York Times, "In addition to the American Petroleum Institute, major energy companies — ConocoPhillips, the oil and gas company; Alpha Natural Resources, a coal mining giant; and American Electric Power, the nation's biggest coal consumer — have recently joined the Republican Attorneys General Association, bringing in hundreds of thousands of additional dollars to the group, internal documents show. By last year, the association was starting to pull in so much money under Mr. Pruitt's leadership that it decided to break free from its partnership with the Republican State Leadership Committee, a group that represents state elected officials. Within months, the association also set up the Rule of Law Defense Fund, yet another legal entity that allows companies benefiting from the actions of Mr. Pruitt and other

Republican attorneys general to make anonymous donations, in unlimited amounts. Fund-raising skyrocketed." [New York Times, 12/6/14]

April 2014 – November 2015: Pruitt Was A Board Member Of Rule Of Law Defense Fund. According to the Executive Branch Personnel Public Financial Disclosure Report, Scott Pruitt was a board member of the Rule of Law Defense Fund from April 2014 until November 2015. Nov. 2014 – Nov. 2015: Pruitt Was On RAGA's Executive Committee. [RAGA, 11/17/14]

November 2015 – November 2016: Pruitt Was Chairman Of Rule Of Law Defense Fund. According to the Executive Branch Personnel Public Financial Disclosure Report, Scott Pruitt was Chairman of the Rule of Law Defense Fund from November 2015 until November 2016. November 2016 – December 2016: Pruitt Was On Board Of Directors Of Rule Of Law Defense Fund. According to the Executive Branch Personnel Public Financial Disclosure Report, Scott Pruitt was a member of the Board of Directors of the Rule of Law Defense Fund from November 2016 to December 2016.
